## **US Open**

The US Open serves up the final Grand Slam Open of the year. It has become one of the world's premier sports and entertainment spectacles.

The 2021 US Open was the 141st edition of tennis' US Open and the fourth and final Grand Slam event of the year. It was held on outdoor hard courts at the USTA Billie Jean King National Tennis Center in New York City.

Daniil Medvedev won the men's singles title. Emma Raducanu won the women's singles title.

Dominic Thiem and Naomi Osaka were the men's and women's singles defending champions. However, Thiem withdrew from the tournament due to a wrist injury causing him to end his season early. Osaka lost in the third round to Leylah Fernandez.

# Laver Cup

The Laver Cup is an international indoor hard court men's team tennis tournament between Team Europe and Team World, the latter of which is composed of players from all continents except Europe. Held annually since 2017, the tournament is intended to be the Ryder Cup of the tennis world. Normally it takes place two weeks after the US Open, with the location rotating between different host cities. 2022 edition will take place in London.

There are 12 matches played over three days (nine singles and three doubles). Each match victory on day 1 is worth one point, on day 2 two points, and on day 3 three points. The first team to claim 13 points win the tournament. Each player takes the court once or twice for singles, with at least four of the six taking part in doubles. All matches are played as best-of-three, with a 10-point tiebreaker if play goes to a third set.

# Australian Open

In the middle of the cold European winter season, the Australian Open is the first Grand Slam of the year, bringing the heat of a new tennis season to all the fans. AO features men's and women's singles; men's, women's, and mixed doubles; junior's championships; and wheelchair, legends, and exhibition events.

Nicknamed "the happy slam", the tournament is the highest attended Grand Slam event, with more than 812,000 people attending the 2020 tournament.

The event includes 14 day sessions and 11 night sessions. Up to 7 courts (Rod Laver Arena, Hisense Arena, Margaret Court Arena, Show Courts 2 and 3, Courts 6 and 8) will be available for live transmission and for extensive coverage.

## Roland Garros - The French Open





May 16, 2022 - Jun 5, 2022

Winning the French Open is a player dream as it embodies the spirit of Tennis itself. The typical red clay surface makes this tournament the most physical of all Grand Slams.

In 2021 it was the 125th edition of the French Open and the second Grand Slam event of 2021. The main singles draws included 16 qualifiers for men and 16 for women out of 128 players in each draw, the last Grand Slam to still have 128 women qualifiers instead of 96 in line with the other three majors.

Novak Djokovic won the men's singles title over Stefanos Tsitsipas in the final, marking his 19th Grand Slam singles title and making him the first male player to win the double career Grand Slam in the Open Era. Barbora Krejcikova won the women's singles title over Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova in the final, claiming her maiden Grand Slam singles title. This was the first time in French Open history that both singles victors were from Slavic-speaking nations, namely Serbia and the Czech Republic.

This was the first edition of the event to have formal night sessions in the schedule, joining a practice already established at the Australian Open and US Open, with one match having a 21:00 local time start time each day.

No fewer than 7 courts (Philippe Chatrier, Suzanne Lenglen, Court No 1,2,7,3,6) will be available for live HD transmission to bring you one of the most important sports events of the year on your screens!

## Wimbledon

The Championships, Wimbledon, commonly known simply as Wimbledon or The Championships, is the oldest tennis tournament in the world and is widely regarded as the most prestigious. It has been held at the All England Club in Wimbledon, London, since 1877 and is played on outdoor grass courts, with a retractable roof over two courts since 2019.

Wimbledon is one of the four Grand Slam tennis tournaments, the others being the Australian Open, the French Open and the US Open. Wimbledon is the only major still played on grass, which is the traditional tennis playing surface.
